## Description of the Proposed Project [24 CFR 58.32; 40 CFR 1508.25]:

The City of Avon Park will administer the CDBG mitigation that includes the fire station main structure will undergo critical facilities hardening of exterior walls, ceiling, roof removal and replacement, new firetruck doors and exterior doors, window shutters, interior ceiling repair, interior wall repairs and flooding; mechanical hardening will include ventilation/air conditioning unit replacements; electrical hardening will include electrical upgrades, new main electrical panel and new paging system; food and shelter will include kitchen upgrades, bunk room upgrades, remove wall for additional space. The exemption environmental review includes design costs, construction inspection and grant administration.





# Military Airport 15000'






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
